Like Hurricane Irma, Irma Thomas is a force of nature!



For a voice that makes you sit up straight, look to Irma Thomas to deliver. The New Orleans native is 69, and she's been singing pretty much her whole life.

"I can't remember when I didn't sing," she says. "It was just a part of life."

When Thomas heard that she had been selected as one of NPR's 50 Great Voices, she said, "I kinda lit up, like, 'Wow, I'm among 50 great voices!' Like, 'Hey!' "

Thomas' voice is a true New Orleans treasure. The soul queen isn't just from the city — she's *of* the city, and her voice reflects that.

Once again, I hope you're all well and safe and I look forward to seeing you soon.






JAZZ ON THE BEACH

JOTB archived programs are broadcast on WUCF-FM Orlando (89.9) on Saturdays from 12-3pm.

September is usually a good month for me. It is a birthday month after all. So it this September I'll be 93! It's a good age to be, considering that 92 was the best I could do in the previous year. Okay, I guess I look pretty good for 93 and generally feel good, and act like I'm okay. But hey, I know I'm 93. I can't drive or walk too well, can't stand too long, and need help with those pesky buttons on a daily basis. Nevertheless, I've survived so far with what I think has been an interesting life.

You may wonder how I could celebrate 50 years of jazz on the radio, after working for RCA for 39 years (a great company, by the way). Well, I found that I could produce a weekly jazz show with little impact on my regular management job at Cape Canaveral Air Force Station. I remember when Judy Roberts, the pianist from Chicago, called me at the Cape to tell me she had a gig in Orlando that night and could I be there. No, was the answer. There was a launch that night and I couldn't make it. There were, however, lots of open Tuesday nights when Lorraine and I drove over to Walt Disney World Village so I could interview jazz stars the likes of Teddy Wilson or Zoot Sims (wow!). The 1960s and 1970s was a very busy period at Cape Canaveral, and it would be quite a while before any astronauts showed up.

As an American (I became one in 1954), it was a great thing to be working at the Cape, and I think we all had a sense of pride in what we were doing. There were quite a lot of venues in Cocoa Beach for Cape workers to relax and listen to jazz. I provided some on the radio and was happy about that. *Jazz on the Beach* began on WRKT (Rocket radio) in July 1967 -- 50 years ago.

I remember one week we supported seven different missile launches ending up on Monday morning. It was our radar and telemetry and data systems that provided the tracking information and post-launch evaluation. I say *our* radars; actually they belonged to the United States Air Force and RCA operated most of them.


